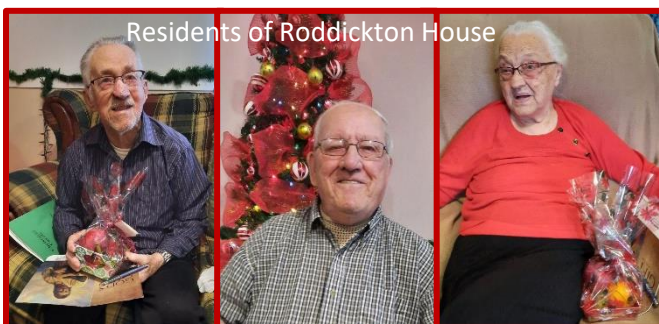
Christmas Miracle

The Lord is good, I love Him, and I want to reign with Him eternally. I praise God!

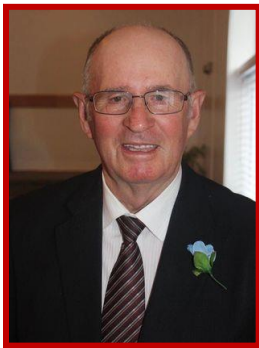
