Toronto Special Meetings

The Apostolic Faith Church, Toronto, ON, u nder the leadership of the District Superintendent Rev. Chris Hewlett, was blessed to host the 2023 Special Meetings themed "Revive thy Work O Lord" from August 23-27.

These meetings were graced with the presence of pastors and ministers from our churches across Canada. At its peak, over



500+ combined attendees joined both physically and virtually for the meetings and we were incredibly grateful to God for the outpouring of His manifold blessings.

The opening service on Wednesday night commenced with "Jesus my Lord," by the orchestra followed by, "Thank You for the Cross Lord," and "I Gave my Life for Thee," by the choir, setting the tone for a Spirit-filled service. Rev. Chris Hewlett gave a hearty welcome to all in attendance, conveying warm greetings from the Board of Directors at the district headquarters in Roddickton, NL. He then introduced the pastors and their spouses from the branch churches. Brother Tobi Shobukola, pastor of the Toronto congregation, also gave a friendly welcome to all as he expressed his excitement in seeing the representatives from the different branches visit to support the special meetings. Beautiful hymns such as, "There Shall Be Showers of Blessing," "Revive Us Again," and "Nothing but the Blood," rang out as voices lifted to worship and praise God. Testimonies of victory followed. Sharron Canning quickly rose to

her feet to praise God for keeping her in the valleys she experienced. Darius showed his excitement to be in a place where the saints of God are. He told how God saved him from a miserable life of sin and gave thanks that he had a mom who prayed for him and didn't give up until He came to God.

Norma Rigor sang a solo entitled, "Free at Last," before Rev. Chris Hewlett preached. His topic was, "Are You Ready for Revival?" He referenced Psalm 85:6-11 and implored us all to pray for revival, noting that revival starts from within the church when we individually

seek the face of God. Additionally, he identified four major requirements to stir up revival in the church: 1. We must be an obedient people, 2. We must be a humble people, 3. We must be a praying people and 4. We must be diligently waiting upon God. God wants to give you a fresh touch of His Spirit. What is revival? It is restoration to life, reawakening of our senses, interest, our love for God, our love for the truth, a stirring in our souls. He also used *Joel 2:12-14* and *18-25* to further explain an outward expression of sorrow and repentance and rendering of our hearts before we can have personal revival. A wonderful time of prayer followed.

The Thursday evening service was another evening of spiritual blessings, refreshments, and inspiration. The orchestra started the service by playing, "How Great Thou Art," followed by the choir singing, "These are the days of Elijah." The congregation joined the choir in singing a variety of songs from the hymnal. After the opening prayer and announcements, the choir proceeded to sing, "There is a Balm in Gilead," leading into the testimony session. Patsy Hewlett testified to being re-anointed by the Holy Spirit during prayer following the sermon at the previous service and the grace given to her and her husband to build a Christian home on the solid rock of Christ Jesus, just one month after they got married. This was amongst other

inspirational testimonies from the saints about God's power to save from sin and deliver in times of trials.

Following a special song by Pearl Akazue titled, "Who Can Move the Mountains That Are Hindering You Today," brother Foluso Oladunni from Edmonton, Alberta, delivered the sermon for the hour which he expressed was a message of warning. The theme was taken from Isaiah 55:6 "Seek ye the Lord while He may be found, call ye upon Him while He is near." He instructed everyone to surrender their life to Christ, noting the significance of seizing the opportunity now since it is the dispensation of grace. How shall we escape if we neglect so great a salvation? This opportunity to come to Christ will not be forever. We have a high priest who will feel our infirmities. He will give you peace of mind. He's the help for the helpless. When you are sick, He will heal you. He can open doors for you. He will give you a joy that no one can explain. Call upon Him – there is a time you will call and maybe He will not be there. *Proverbs 8:17.* When the door is shut it is shut forever. Friday evening, the third service of the special meetings, started with the great song, "The Great Physician Now is Near," by the orchestra after which the choir sang a



medley of timeless songs. There was also a special rendition of the song, "Just a Little Talk with Jesus," by a men's combined choir. This exciting song summoned a wonderful spirit of praise and worship in our midst, and everyone sang the congregational songs heartily. Raymond Cassell's Testimony

January 26, 2001

The morning my wife got saved,
December 27, 1999, I felt my
world just fall apart around
me. I couldn't find any
answers to anything. I made
both of our lives miserable.

From December 27 to February 8, 2000, I lived a life of misery. I even thought of suicide, but

I guess there was a seed planted in my heart when I was young child. I couldn't go through with it because I knew that I would end up in a lost eternity.

On Sunday night, February 6, my wife, and her sister wanted me to go to church with them. I said no. They said they would pray for me. I told them that I couldn't understand how anyone could pray for someone to be miserable.

After they left, I watched some religious programs on television. I decided I would go and pray. I took the Bible in my hands, opened it up, and laid it on the bed to give me strength. That was the very first time in 47 years that I ever knelt and asked the Lord to come into my life.

That night, I didn't find salvation, so I prayed for a greater desire to seek the Lord.

Monday night when my wife and I went to bed, I asked her if she ever tried to visualize Jesus on the cross. I told her that I wish I had a knob to turn like a view master on my head, so that I could see what I wanted to see. Then I told her that I had prayed Sunday night, but I didn't feel anything.

Tuesday morning, after my wife went to work, I got up, ate breakfast, and turned to go into the living room. The Bible on the end of the table caught my eye and I felt like I just had to read it. After reading for a while, I went and knelt by the sofa and prayed.

After a time, I got up and sat in the armchair. At that time, I felt peaceful. I rested my head back and closed my eyes. Things began to happen. I thank God for that morning because the Lord did show me things as though I was looking through a view master. First, I began to see beautiful colors like I had never seen before, like the red of an eastern sky in the morning, before rain. Then, I saw a small light. It seemed to come right from outer space to my face and stopped. Then it moved away, and I found myself moving my head jut to keep it focused. That light went out of sight and a bigger, brighter light came into view. It was a light with a halo around it. After that, I saw the most beautiful colors. They could never be copied by human. Then, I saw a picture. It was black and jagged on the outside, and the most beautiful city came about quarter of the way into the picture. It had stained glass windows and many steeples. After viewing this for a while, I could find myself weeping. Then, a black hand came up out of the perimeter into the beautiful blue picture. I saw a beautiful river as clear as crystal. I could see the rocks on the bottom and the green grass on the banks of the river. The water flowed very smooth but began and ended in a short distance. After that, two more lights came very close to me. One was orange and the other was in the brightest white. Their shapes were a bit strange – sort of kidney shaped.

After seeing all of this, the devil spoke to me and said, "You're not seeing anything. It's only the suncatcher in the window." I knew this wasn't true because the sun wasn't even high enough to be on the window. I said to the devil, "I can prove it's not the suncatcher!" So, I exercised a bit of faith and put my hand over my eyes. When I did this, I saw a spot of blood, crimson red, between my hand and my eyes, with a portion of it ready

to drop. I saw it drop. It was so real that I whipped my hand down and looked at it. I then looked at my shirt to see where the blood fell.

It wasn't on my hand or my shirt, but it was applied to my heart. When I realized what I was doing, I was running back and forth the hallway, praising the Lord. I knew there was a change in me because I felt such peace and joy. I am still praising the Lord today for the wonderful and miraculous way He saved me.

Fort McMurray


une 29 marked the end of the school year, and the onset of summer. This summer was a busy time with much travel.

A Special Visit from Our District Superintendent


The highlight of our summer was the visit of our District Superintendent, Pastor Chris, and his lovely wife, Patsy
