Every hour, day, week, or year brings a new surprise, a new challenge that sometimes causes our faith to go in test mode. The songwriter wrote... "Life is easy when you're up on the mountain, and you've got peace of mind, like you've never known. But then things change, and you're down in the valley. Don't lose faith for you're never alone."

2023 started out as a normal year for us. We were hoping our health would be a positive encounter going forward. Change came quickly leaving very uncomfortable feelings and many painful moments for me.

Around springtime I started to experience abnormal episodes with joint pain. It became evident as my mobility started to decline. I could no longer do my daily chores. I continued to try and fight through, hoping to attain some relief. Nearing the end of summer my mobility was well below the normal level. My condition had worsened, and I knew that my future would be different. Due to this problem I began to question, rethink, and contemplate what will be next? My strength was failing in my hands, arms, shoulders, and legs. I could no longer dress myself without help. I found that very humiliating; sitting, standing, lifting, getting in and out of bed was not an easy chore. The struggle increased daily, causing me to navigate through periods of fatigue and into a deep feeling of hopelessness.

I sought medical help and after consultation with the specialist I was diagnosed with systemic arthritis know as Chondrocalcinosis. Immediately, it was confirmed, there is no cure. Thoughts were rapidly running through my mind like never before. What next? What can I do? Where shall I turn?

In early September Pastor Quinlan and his wife came to visit us. They saw the condition was different than their previous visit. In conversation one afternoon we talked about growing up in isolation and the medical challenges our parents faced. We reminisced how the people depended on God, through prayer for healing and comfort.

My memory of Psalm 50:15 "And call upon me in the day of trouble: I will deliver thee, and thou shalt glorify me." What a consolation to know there is an answer to every situation! I spoke to Pastor Quinlan saying, "I think you should pray." Without hesitation he stood, and we prayed. It did something for me. I felt different and my faith increased. I believed something was about to happen.

I hadn't been able to attend church for many weeks. My body could not withstand the struggle. However, on September 17, 2023, I was encouraged to attend. I made my way through the pain and discomfort. Pastor Eric in his opening remarks mentioned my presence after a long absence. He said, "Maybe he will tell us his story in testimony." I stood and told some of the things I was experiencing. I also felt led to ask for prayer for my situation. I stated, "I really believe in prayer and asked to be anointed and prayed over." I also asked for other believers to join in the prayer. I asked the Pastor to decide when it would happen. He immediately responded, "There's no time better than NOW."
