OBJECT: A souvenir

EXAMPLE: See this little bear? This is a souvenir. Raise your hand if you know what a souvenir is.

(Let one of your students give his/her answer.)

Right, it is something to help you remember—a “memorial.” This little bear sits on my shelf, and when I look at him I remember the time my dad took me to Magic Mountain; I was nine years old.

Jesus instructed His disciples on something to do in remembrance of Him. He used the bread and juice of the Passover Supper as memorial: something to do that would help them remember. The broken bread to remember Jesus' broken body, and the grape juice to remember His that was shed for their salvation.

As Christians, we take part in the Lord's Supper to remind ourselves how and why Jesus died for us.
