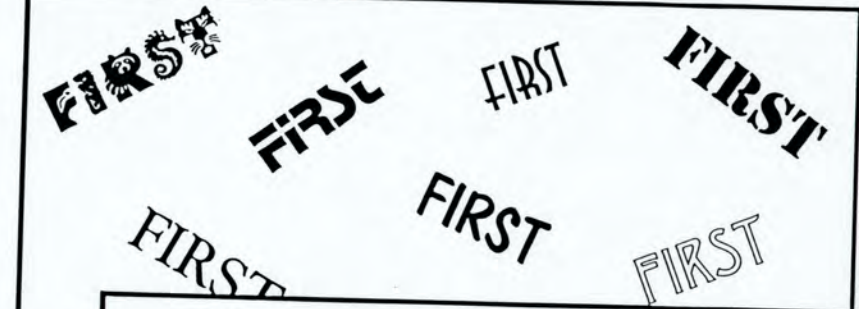

7. Read Isaiah 41:10. How is God involved in our doing what He calls us to do?

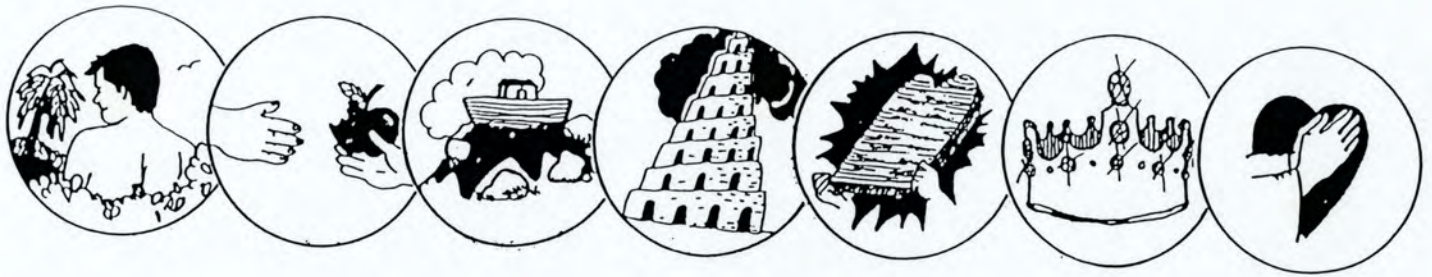

HONOR SEARCH

Hide quarters and questions.
Give them an appropriate time limit for the area to be searched and the size of the group. Tell them they are to find a question ONLY. If they find anything else they are to LEAVE IT THERE! If they take a quarter, they are disqualified from the game.
(Good lesson on integrity and honesty!)
After they sit down, draw a name and that student must correctly answer his question if he found one. If he answers correctly, he then has 5 ~ 10 seconds to go find as many quarters as he can.
Have extra quarters so there is enough for everyone qualified to have a chance. You may need to have the quarters hidden in a separate room or part of the room partitioned off so they can't see them being hidden.

For a prize for any contest, fill a container with quarters and let them see how many they can get in a clothespin!

Write each of the ten commandments on two index cards. They then are RANDOMLY arranged on butcher paper, numbered and fastened to a Board. Put quarters under some of the cards! The first child selects two numbers. If they are the same commandment they get a quarter. If not the next one selects two more numbers, etc. keep that quarter and also a quarter on it they get to
