“Mine Eyes Have Seen Thy Salvation”

The key verse for this lesson is. “There hath not failed one word of all his good promise” (1 Kings 8:56). Reviewing the four verses below helps to reassure us of that truth.

A promise was given:

“Behold, a virgin shall conceive, and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel” (Isaiah 7:14).

The promise was fulfilled:

“For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, which is Christ the Lord” (Luke 2:11).

Believers looked for and found the Promise:

“Where is he that is born King of the Jews? for we have seen his star in the east, and are come to worship him” (Matthew 2:2).

God’s promises are sure:

“For with God nothing shall be impossible” (Luke 1:37).

In Hebrews 10:23 we are told, “Let us hold fast the profession of our faith without wavering; (for he is faithful that promised;)” The verses below tell of Simeon who was a servant of God and believed God’s promises. He was rewarded for that faith. Some of the words have been made bold. As you read through the verses, find each of the bold words in the word-find. Do you think God still keeps his promises to us today?

“And, behold, there was a man in **Jerusalem**, whose name was **Simeon**; and the same man was just and devout, **waiting** for the consolation of **Israel**: and the Holy Ghost was upon him. And it was revealed unto him by the **Holy Ghost**, that he should not see death, before he had seen the Lord’s **Christ**. And he came by the **Spirit** into the **temple**: and when the parents brought in the **child Jesus**, to do for him after the **custom** of the law, Then took he him up in his **arms**, and **blessed** God, and said, **Lord**, now lettest thou thy **servant** depart in **peace**, according to thy **word**: For mine **eyes** have **seen** thy **salvation**.” — Luke 2:25-30
