7. "I've chosen to be neutral about the whole matter." (Matthew 6:24)

8. "I believe God is too good to send anyone to Hell." (Luke 13:3)

9. "My sins are too small to worry about." (Romans 6:23)

10. "I am seeking, but I cannot seem to find Christ." (Jeremiah 29:13)
