

Which Approach?



There are two ways to approach the person to whom you are witnessing:

The **direct approach** and the **indirect approach**

- The **direct approach** gets straight to the point. For example, "You need to get saved."
 - The **indirect approach** is more subtle. Guide the conversation so the other person will ask about Christianity.

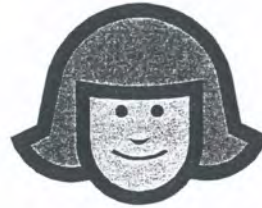


