Date: _____
Title: A Place of Forgiveness/The Two Debtors
Text/Story: Luke 7:36-50
Main idea: God extends forgiveness to all; there is much love in hearts of those who the Lord has forgiven.
Key Verse: Psalm 78:38

Time	Activity	Description
	Pre-Lesson Demonstration	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Materials: large burlap or strong cloth bag; bricks or large rocks; labels or slips of paper • Brainstorm a list of sins that God saves us from; have students write them down on labels or pieces of paper and tape them to brick/rocks • Put all the bricks/rocks into bag to show what it's like as a sinner to carry these sins in our hearts; have someone volunteer to carry it • Show how God takes the burden of sin from our lives--remove the bricks/rocks from the bag--and God promised to forgive all, no matter how many sins or how heavy they are
	Lesson Luke 7:36-50 Worksheet: "Know Your Parable"	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • If working with younger students, put these objects into a paper bag; fancy jar, hair ribbon, Kleenex, five dollar bill, 50 cents; as you tell the story, take out the objects one at a time and relate to the story; do the worksheet together • If working with older students, break the students into pairs or groups and have them read the story and complete the worksheet; when done, review the story and discuss important points together as a class
	Post-Lesson Response Mobile	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Materials: wire hanger, string, tape, markers, glue, construction paper or tag board, glitter, stickers, calligraphy pens • On one piece of paper, write the statement "God forgives" and tape on string and tie onto the hanger • Provide each student with smaller pieces of paper and have them write down their one-word response to the statement (how they feel about it, e.g., happy, wonderful, wow, relieved, joyful, thankful etc.), on both sides of the paper • Each response word should be done as creatively as possible, using glitter, calligraphy pens, stickers, string etc. • Attach strings to each piece of paper and tie to the mobile
