Jochebed was an Israeli woman living under the bondage of slavery in Egypt when the Pharaoh gave the ruling that, “Every son that is born ye shall cast into the river” (Exodus 1:22). This was an especially sorrowful message to her family because they were soon to have a new baby in their home. If it were a son, they would have to try to keep him a secret. Jochebed’s faith in God was greater than her fear of the Egyptian people.
